who called your Church to bear witness that you were in Christ reconciling the world to yourself: help us to proclaim the good news of your love, that all who hear it may be drawn to you; through him who was lifted up on the cross, and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

God our creator,

you feed your children with the true manna, the living bread from heaven: let this holy food sustain us through our earthly pilgrimage until we come to that place where hunger and thirst are no more; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Gospel Reading

²¹From that time on, Jesus began to show his disciples that he must go to Jerusalem and undergo great suffering at the hands of the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and on the third day be raised. ²²And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him, saying, 'God forbid it, Lord! This must never happen to you.' ²³But he turned and said to Peter, 'Get behind me, Satan! You are a stumbling-block to me; for you are setting your mind not on divine things but on human things.'

²⁴Then Jesus told his disciples, 'If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. ²⁵For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake will find it. ²⁶For what will it profit them if they gain the whole world but forfeit their life? Or what will they give in return for their life?

²⁷For the Son of Man is to come with his angels in the glory of his Father, and then he will repay everyone for what has been done. ²⁸Truly I tell you, there are some standing here who will not taste death before they see the Son of Man coming in his kingdom.' *Matthew 16.21-end*

Thought for the week:

Poor Peter! So often I associate with him - quick to speak and to think he is doing the right thing, when in fact a pause before speaking or acting may well lead to a more appropriate response. In last week's gospel Jesus commended him for perceiving that Jesus was the promised Messiah, and in turn promised Peter that the embryonic church would be built upon him. This week Peter is castigated for trying to protect Jesus – doing what he thought was



the right thing. Jesus does not need human protection – he has a divine task to carry out. As Jesus goes willingly to the cross, here he also reminds his disciples that the cross will also be a shadow on their own lives too. In the Galilee resurrection appearance Jesus tells Peter, 'Very truly, I tell you, when you were younger, you used to fasten your own belt and to go wherever you wished. But when you grow old, you will stretch out your hands, and someone else will fasten a belt around you and take you where you do not wish to go.' (He said this to indicate the kind of death by which he would glorify God.)' (John 21.18-19).

Peter probably was crucified, in Rome, having given all he had to follow Jesus.

We are not generally called to die physically for Jesus but the cross still shadows us through the little (or larger) sacrifices that we are called to make as disciples of Jesus. This does not mean that we deliberately suffer, but rather, perhaps, that we are alert to what Jesus asks of each one of us - whether it be life affirming and giving or not quite what we might choose.


Recycling at St Luke's

As one of the ways to demonstrate our commitment to living more sustainably and caring for creation, we have set up an area at the back of church by the servery, where things that can be difficult to recycle at home can be brought and members of the 'eco-team' will ensure they are taken to be recycled correctly.

There are two boxes:

- One for used pill packets
- One for dead batteries and empty make up containers.

There is a larger 'hamper' for packaging that can be recycled in supermarkets. This rubbish has this label



Please do bring any of these items of rubbish and place them in the appropriate container. Many people making small changes in the end makes a big difference.
