## Week Commencing: 10th November, Remembrance Sunday

This Sunday is Remembrance Sunday and we will have the usual Service of the Word at **10.20 am** which will include the two minute silence. There will be a simple (quiet) activity for any children present. There will also be a service of Holy Communion at 8.00 am – to which everyone is warmly invited. In the evening All Saints Church is hosting the Sundays at Six with an All Souls Eucharist.

#### **The Collect**

God, our refuge and strength, bring near the day when wars shall cease and poverty and pain shall end, that earth may know the peace of heaven through Jesus Christ our Lord

#### **Post Communion Prayer**

God of peace, whose Son Jesus Christ proclaimed the kingdom and restored the broken to wholeness of life: look with compassion on the anguish of the world, and by your healing power make whole both people and nations; through our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ

#### **First Reading**

I give you thanks, O Lord and King, and praise you, O God my Saviour.

I give thanks to your name, for you have been my protector and helper and have delivered me from destruction ,and from the trap laid by a slanderous tongue, from lips that fabricate lies.

In the face of my adversaries you have been my helper and delivered me, in the greatness of your mercy and of your name, from grinding teeth about to devour me, from the hand of those seeking my life, from the many troubles I endured, from choking fire on every side, and from the midst of fire that I had not kindled, from the deep belly of Hades, from an unclean tongue and lying words— the slander of an unrighteous tongue to the king.

My soul drew near to death, and my life was on the brink of Hades below. They surrounded me on every side, and there was no one to help me; I looked for human assistance, and there was none.

Then I remembered your mercy, O Lord, and your kindness from of old, for you rescue those who wait for you and save them from the hand of their enemies. And I sent up my prayer from the earth, and begged for rescue from death. I cried out, 'Lord, you are my Father; do not forsake me in the days of trouble, when there is no help against the proud.

I will praise your name continually, and will sing hymns of thanksgiving.' My prayer was heard, for you saved me from destruction and rescued me in time of trouble. For this reason I thank you and praise you, and I bless the name of the Lord. *Ecclus 51.1-12* 

#### Second Reading

What then are we to say about these things? If God is for us, who is against us? He who did not withhold his own Son, but gave him up for all of us, will he not with him also give us everything else? Who will bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. Who is to condemn? It is Christ Jesus, who died, yes, who was raised, who is at the right hand of God, who indeed intercedes for us. Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will hardship, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? As it is written,

'For your sake we are being killed all day long;

we are accounted as sheep to be slaughtered.'

No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord. *Rom 8.31-end*

## Thought for the week...

Remembering is important isn't it. The church has recognised that

by designating a whole season now – the kingdom season in which we remember many things – and by remembering, we can ourselves be re-membered.

This Sunday we remember the very best and the very worst of humankind. If it were not for people's greed, lust for power, need to be top dog, covetousness, and more, then there would be no wars and we would not need to do what we are doing at this time. All people, all nations, would live alongside each other peaceably.

But people are people. Whatever our theology of the nature of human beings, we are, in some way, fallen creatures. And so we fight – and devise the most appalling treatments for 'the enemy'. When I was in Vietnam some years ago I saw the metal tiger cages that prisoners of war had been placed in – and I had to turn away.

Conflict brings out the worst in people. It can led to utter loss of hope.

And yet, as we know, it can also bring out the very best. This season abounds with tales of the heroism of a whole variety of men and women in more than just the two world wars. What inspired these people to put themselves in the firing line, to protect others, to fight for what they believed to be right, knowing it might cost them their lives?

For some it was philanthropism but for many it as an innate sense of divine hope – perhaps buried for years but brought to the surface at time of need.

The writer of Ecclesiasticus called on God for help at such a time – and knew deep down that help would come. Despite the oppression of his enemy, He trusted in God.

That trust is affirmed by Paul in his letter to the suffering Roman church. Belief in God does not lift us out of suffering but, as our forbears learned, it means that death - however dreadful – is not the end.

As we remember today all those who gave their lives - and give thanks – and pray for those still facing conflict around the world – we can be re-membered, our lives put back on the right track, by their example and sheer courage, and by the knowledge that, as Paul writes:

No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.


