Trinity Sunday / Music Sunday

Thank you to everyone who helped out in any way with our street party last weekend – preparing food and other practical matters, as well as praying for dry weather! We had a great time.

This Sunday is Trinity Sunday when we change gear in church and move to 'ordinary time', a time of learning and growing in our shared faith. There is an 8 am Holy Communion service and a 10 am Parish Communion, at which we will also keep Music Sunday and celebrate the gift of music. Sundays at Six is a service of Evensong and Benediction at All Saints.

Next week we are hosting a Deanery confirmation at our 10 am service and look forward to welcoming Bishop Olivia to confirm four adults from our own church and four from other churches. There will still be plenty of space for the usual congregation – do come along, especially if you have never witnessed a confirmation.

Many of you will have heard the sad news that Gerry Knight, our former verger, passed away, quite suddenly, last weekend. He had been ill and is now in the Eternal Arms and at peace. Please do pray for comfort for his wife Hazel and their daughters. May Gerry rest in peace and rise in glory. 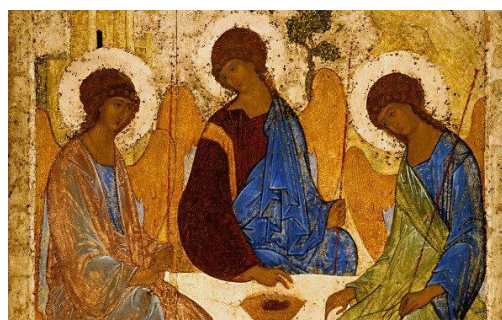
Romans 5.1-5

Thought for the week:

It is almost impossible to understand the concept of the Holy Trinity. How *can* God be three in one?

Many artists have attempted ways of explaining it in art form and some rather trite images have been used (water, ice and steam, for example). Matisse's painting, *Danse*, helps to convey the relationship of the three, always moving in and out of each other, together, and Rublev's beautiful icon of the three angels who visited Abraham is also interpreted as representing the three persons of the Trinity. In the icon the three sit around a table with an open side, inviting the viewer in. We too, are invited, not just to hear about or to look on 'images' of God, but to fully participate in the whole of God – join in the ever moving relationship of love.
