Week commencing: 14th February 2021 The Last Sunday before Lent

As we keep this last Sunday before Lent begins, do think about how you will keep Lent this year. We have already had almost a year of (relative) privations and so this year might be a good opportunity to do some reading or spend time reflecting on God's goodness to us, reconnecting with someone by phone or online, or engaging in research or online action with or for a particular concern, such as the environment or poverty. It is also a good time to pray and to use the little booklets we delivered a week or so ago. My 'schoolfriends' and I are also really enjoying using the 'Friendly February' calendar. I wonder what March will bring?!

Do sign up personally for the diocesan Lent materials, Come and See. Go to https://www.oxford.anglican.org/come-and-see/ and scroll down to click 'register'. You will receive a daily reflection in Lent. Revd. Sally has a few hard copies for those who don't have access to a computer and you could also order your own. We will be using Bishop Steven's messages during our Sunday morning services in Lent.
