Thought for the week: Love and Loss

Mothering Sunday is always a bittersweet day. For those who keep Lent strictly it is a day off from our Lenten fast – you can enjoy your favourite tippie or snack. For children (of all ages) it is a time to show mums just how much they care and appreciate the love given, often sacrificially, to them.

But it is also a day of sorrow for those who have lost children or mothers, who are unable to have children, or for whom parents did not offer the best start in life.

It is a day of love, and of loss.

This year that tension will be felt more keenly than ever.

One of my favourite images at this time is that of the pieta – the image of Mary, the mother of Jesus, holding the body of her dead son as he was taken down from the cross. She was there at his birth and at his death - constant, faithful, gentle, loving through the pain that old Simeon had warned her of when Jesus was just 40 days old – a tiny babe in her arms in the Temple.

I bought the pieta here in Israel last time we were there. It is made of olive wood, smooth to the touch and evocatively faceless. It could be any woman holding her beloved child. You may like to spend some time reflecting on what it says to you.

To me, I am reminded that Mary knows our pains – as well as our joys – and can bring them to God for us in prayer.

Have you got your census letter?

The census is coming, and it's about you. Without the information you share, it'd be more difficult to understand your community's needs and to plan and fund public services.


By taking part and encouraging your congregation to do the same, you will help inform decisions about the services you and your community need, like doctors' surgeries and new schools.

Census day is on March 21, but households will now be receiving letters with online codes explaining how they can complete their forms. If you don't get one in the next couple of weeks, please get in touch with the census contact centre. You can also request a paper questionnaire if you'd prefer to complete your census that way.


There is lots of support available such as a help area on the census website and a contact centre that can give you help over the phone and guidance in a range of languages and accessible formats, including paper questionnaires and large print. You can also use your postcode to find local census support centres on the census website.

The Office for National Statistics (ONS) runs the census in England and Wales and is independent from the government. All information is held securely for 100 years. Statistics are only compiled based on anonymised data and personal information is not shared with any organisation and is never sold.
