Week commencing: 14th November 2021 Remembrance Sunday: Word service

This Sunday is **Remembrance Sunday** and so our service will be a Word service Act of Remembrance and will start at **10.30** am so that we can observe two minutes silence at 11 am with the nation. There will be a service of Holy Communion at 8 am in church, and Sundays at Six on zoom.

Morning Prayer also continues daily, Tuesday – Saturday on Zoom, at 8.30 am (9 am on Sat.) **Evening Prayer**, on Fridays at 5pm also on zoom (but note there is no service on 1st Friday monthly).

Thought for the week: our readings this week are unusual and at the main service we do not have a gospel reading as it is a Word service. In the gospel set for today (Mark 13. 1-8) Jesus speaks to his disciples of the destruction of the temple in Jerusalem. This came to pass in 70 AD, around 40 years later, when Jerusalem was taken totally by the Romans. For the Jewish nation, to lose their central physical focus of faith (for the third – and final time) was unbearable. Today visitors to the holy city can see the remains of the huge blocks of stone from the Temple platform lying in the vast dents that they made in the pavement when they fell. Even today the last remaining part of the wall is nick- named 'the wailing wall'.



Over the ages since then we have seen how wars and conflicts have destroyed heritage sites and laid waste beautiful places, causing heartbreak. Yet surely, far more painful, is the loss of innocent lives, in their millions. Each of those lives is precious – and known – to God. That is brought home to me each year at the fall of poppy petals in the Royal British Legion Festival of Remembrance at the Royal Albert Hall. The number seems to grow each year – and that is only those from our own nations.

Let us never forget the courage of those who gave their lives, that we might live now. And perhaps let's think about how we might live in ways that are honouring to their memory.
