Light Trick or Treat! We are keen not to encourage the keeping of Halloween as a time of spooking people and we certainly do not encourage Trick or Treat. It is a season of remembering with affection and giving thanks for those we love and see no more. But we are not killjoys!! So... on Saturday 31st October, All Hallows Eve, we will hold as near as we can this year to a Light Party. Families are invited to drop by the church between 5.00 pm and 6.30 pm where they will be greeted with Light packs to take away and use at home. There will be candles to light (safely and covid-securely) and possibly even some treats. Children (or adults too!)might like to come in fancy dress – not as ghosts and ghouls but as Saints – which is your favourite Saints? We will make a display of photos for the congregation to see the next day.

Smile Amazon Fundraising: If you shop on Amazon you will have seen that they no longer work with Easyfundraising, so if you are signed up to that scheme your purchases no longer generate funds for St Luke's. However, they now have their own fundraising scheme called Amazon Smile and we have created an account so that all your Amazon purchases will generate a 0.5% donation to St Luke's. To use this new scheme, always go to Amazon by using the https://smile.amazon.co.uk/ link (instead of the normal amazon.co.uk). Just under the search box is a link "Supporting" where you need to choose us as the charity you want to support. Unfortunately the name we are listed under is that of our charity commission registration, which is somewhat long at "The Parochial Church Council Of The Ecclesiastical Parish Of St. Luke's, Maidenhead", and needless to say there are lots of other "The Parochial Church Council Of The Ecclesiastical Parish Of St. Luke's" charities as well, so we can be a bit difficult to find.

The Magnet site re-development: 'I am writing on behalf of Countryside Properties who, as you may be aware, are working in partnership with the Royal Borough of Windsor & Maidenhead to bring forward proposals to redevelop the site on Saint-Cloud Way, currently the former Magnet Leisure Centre.

With leisure centre facilities transferred to Braywick Leisure Centre, the site has been identified by the Council as a sustainable location for new homes. The vision is to develop high quality homes, made up of both market sale and affordable tenures, alongside landscaped courtyards and public realm improvements.

In the next stage of the public consultation, the project team will soon be hosting a series of online public events to discuss the proposals and would be delighted if you were able to attend, they will be taking place on the following days:
