Week commencing: 8th November 2020 Remembrance Day

On Thursday we began another national lock down, which has closed places of worship, along with many other public places. At least this time clergy are able to go into church and so we will be able to broadcast Sunday services from inside our beautiful buildings. We are still (late Thursday) waiting for the fine detail but I am grateful to the team who work on Zoom etc and to all who will ensure that our worship continues in a safe environment – for most of you, at home!

Please do join in our Zoom worship each Sunday, or watch the recording later in the day from the website. If you are zooming live please remember the etiquette – stay muted unless invited to unmute and compose yourself as if you are in church, actively participating, respectfully. If the phone rings or you need to move away from the screen, please turn your camera off. Once the service is ended each week you will be invited to 'stay for coffee' (yes, provide your own!) and to join a breakout room to chat to others for a while.

Our services for the lock down period will be Word services as I do not believe it is fair to have communion only for the very few in church and it is not theologically appropriate to consecrate the elements of bread and wine through the internet. The whole point is that it is comm*UNION* so we will wait once more, until we can share communion together. You may like to make a spiritual communion and can find details on the CofE website.

This Sunday our service will be an act of Remembrance at 10.30 am so that hopefully we can observe the national two minute silence at 11 am. The Zoom link for this Sunday only is:
