Week commencing: 19th February, Last Sunday before Lent

Our 10 am service this week is Parish Communion. This is the last Sunday before Lent and we will then keep Ash Wednesday on 22nd February with

a service of Holy Communion with ashing at 10 am and also at 7.30 pm. The evening service will be followed by the introduction to the Lent course. This will be zoomed for just this week. See later in this sheet for Lent course details.

The Collect

Almighty Father,
whose Son was revealed in majesty
before he suffered death upon the cross:
give us grace to perceive his glory,
that we may be strengthened to suffer with him
and be changed into his likeness,
from glory to glory;
who is alive and reigns with you,
in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
one God, now and for ever.

Post Communion

Holy God,
we see your glory in the face of Jesus Christ:
may we who are partakers at his table
reflect his life in word and deed,
that all the world may know
his power to change and save.
This we ask through Jesus Christ our Lord.

A reading from the Book of Exodus

12The LORD said to Moses, 'Come up to me on the mountain, and wait there; and I will give you the tablets of stone, with the law and the commandment, which I have written for their instruction.' 13So Moses set out with his assistant Joshua, and Moses went up into the mountain of God. 14To the elders he had said, 'Wait here for us, until we come to you again; for Aaron and Hur are with you; whoever has a dispute may go to them.'

15Then Moses went up on the mountain, and the cloud covered the mountain. 16The glory of the LORD settled on Mount Sinai, and the cloud covered it for six days; on the seventh day he called to Moses out of the cloud. 17Now the appearance of the glory of the LORD was like a devouring fire on the top of the mountain in the sight of the people of Israel. 18Moses entered the cloud, and went up on the mountain. Moses was on the mountain for forty days and forty nights. *Exodus 24: 12-end*

The Gospel Reading

1Jesus took with him Peter and James and his brother John and led them up a high mountain, by themselves. 2And he was transfigured before them, and his face shone like the sun, and his clothes became dazzling white. 3Suddenly there appeared to them Moses and Elijah, talking with him. 4Then Peter said to Jesus, 'Lord, it is good for us to be here; if you wish, I will make three dwellings here, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah.' 5While he was still speaking, suddenly a bright cloud overshadowed them, and from the cloud a voice said, 'This is my Son, the Beloved; with him I am well pleased; listen to him!' 6When the disciples heard this, they fell to the ground and were

overcome by fear. 7But Jesus came and touched them, saying, 'Get up and do not be afraid.' 8And when they looked up, they saw no one except Jesus himself alone.

9As they were coming down the mountain, Jesus ordered them, 'Tell no one about the vision until after the Son of Man has been raised from the dead.'

Thought for the week



This week we turn our faces to Lent, Holy Week and Jesus' suffering. We have one, last glimpse of Jesus' glory today – just as his disciples did *en route* to Jerusalem for what would turn out to be the last time, with Jesus.

The story of the transfiguration is beautiful. It must have been amazing for Peter, James and John as the disciples closest to Jesus shared an intimate moment of vision and encouragement. Closeness to Jesus does not make one perfect, and Peter put his foot in it (as he so often did!). He wanted to make 'dwellings'

(literally, booths or tents) to hang on to the vison, to make it more permanent, allowing the disciples to almost wallow in it, to avoid the reality that would face them of life at the bottom of the mountain.

They could not – they had to go back down the mountain and get on with the banalities and the encroaching sufferings, of real life. But the vison remained with them – deep inside them rather than in suspended tents.

God allows us glimpses of his glory in all sorts of unexpected places and times (a sunset, a new baby, in church...) and these can sustain us too as we face everyday life.

- That we may prepare for, and keep, a holy Lent.
