Our main service this Sunday will be a **Parish Communion** at 10 am, to which all are warmly invited in church and on zoom. At midday Daisy Trillow will be baptised and all are warmly welcome at that service tool. Revd. Nicola, Ben and Luke will be joining us for that service and will arrive a little earlier so that they can catch up with anyone who wishes to chat (safely) with them.

Morning Prayer also continues daily, Tuesday – Saturday on Zoom at 9am; **Evening Prayer**, on Fridays at 5pm also on zoom.

Next Sunday we will celebrate our **Harvest Festival.** We will have an All Age Holy Communion service both in church and on zoom – please do come along if you can. We'd love to see all ages together thanking God for the riches of creation.

As is our usual practice, everyone is warmly invited to bring a **small plant** (in a plant saucer of some sort) to church to be blessed and then taken to someone who would enjoy it. We look forward to our first chance to get together in a long time.
