Week Commencing: 20th July -Trinity 5

This Sunday our 10 am Parish Communion service will be a littler shorter than usual, without the usual coffee afterwards so that teams can get ready for the afternoon service. There will be a baptism at midday.

We will need to set out gazebos and tables/chairs from 7. 30 am (yes, really!) ready for the afternoon service. Please do come along to help if you are able to do so (and able bodied!). The more helpers, the quicker we can do it – and then have coffee and croissants.

The church will be open to take seats from 2.40 pm.

Parking will be limited (no parking in the churchyard) so please walk if at all possible or use town centre car parks. It will also be possible to park at St. Piran's School, and walk down the hill.

The service will be zoomed using the usual Sunday morning link.

The Collect

Almighty and everlasting God, by whose Spirit the whole body of the Church is governed and sanctified: hear our prayer which we offer for all your faithful people, that in their vocation and ministry they may serve you in holiness and truth to the glory of your name; through our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

Grant, O Lord, we beseech you, that the course of this world may be so peaceably ordered by your governance, that your Church may joyfully serve you in all godly quietness; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

First Reading

¹Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, and Timothy our brother, ²To the saints and faithful brothers and sisters in Christ in Colossae: Grace to you and peace from God our Father.

³In our prayers for you we always thank God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, ⁴for we have heard of your faith in Christ Jesus and of the love that you have for all the saints, ⁵because of the hope laid up for you in heaven. You have heard of this hope before in the word of the truth, ⁶the gospel that has come to you. Just as it is bearing fruit and growing in the whole world, so it has been bearing fruit among yourselves from the day you heard it and truly comprehended the grace of God. ⁷This you learned from Epaphras, our beloved fellow-servant. He is a faithful minister of Christ on your behalf, ⁸and he has made known to us your love in the Spirit.

⁹For this reason, since the day we heard it, we have not ceased praying for you and asking that you may be filled with the knowledge of God's will in all spiritual wisdom and understanding, ¹⁰so that you may lead lives worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing to him, as you bear fruit in every good work and as you grow in the knowledge of God. ¹¹May you be made strong with all the strength that comes from his glorious power, and may you be prepared to endure everything with patience, while joyfully ¹²giving thanks to the Father, who has enabled you to share in the inheritance of the saints in the light. ¹³He has rescued us from the power of darkness and transferred us into the kingdom of his beloved Son, ¹⁴in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins.

38Now as Jesus and his disciples went on their way, he entered a certain village, where a woman named Martha welcomed him into her home. 39She had a sister named Mary, who sat at the Lord's feet and listened to what he was saying. 40But Martha was distracted by her many tasks; so she came to Jesus and asked, 'Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me to do all the work by myself? Tell her then to help me.' 41But the Lord answered her, 'Martha, Martha, you are worried and distracted by many things; 42there is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part, which will not be taken away from her.'

Thought for the week:

Have you ever felt like a headless chicken- running round, doing many things at once?

That's what is happening to Martha in Sunday's gospel.

She welcomed Jesus to her home, but she was still busy with tasks (like visiting someone when they leave the tv on!). Mary sat and listened to Jesus and Martha rushed around.

At first glance Jesus wouldn't win any prizes for family therapy in the Gospel passage. Taking no notice of all the complexities of sibling rivalry, he affirms Mary's attitude and chastises Martha for all her busyness.



It is often easier for us to identify with Martha than with Mary — especially if we are imbued with a hefty dose of Protestant work ethic. When there are things that we think need doing, it is hard to sit still, and even if our bodies are still, our minds are often racing with worries or with thoughts about how we are going to get through our list of things to do.

We shouldn't assume though that Jesus always sided with Mary over Martha. John 11 reflects his closeness and enduring relationship with both sisters. He is simply saying to Martha that at this time and in this place there were more important things to do than rush around. Martha's focus seems to

be on getting jobs done, Mary's seems to be on listening to Jesus with all her heart and mind and soul and strength.

There is no point in replacing guilt about tasks not done with guilt about not being still.

If nothing else, Martha's experience should reassure us that stress is not a 21st century invention but was present in Jesus' time on earth. Jesus is calling Martha — and us — to find balance in our lives. Being still before God should not be another difficult demand on us, or something that is impossible. Mary seems to have taken time out from her usual routine because Jesus was present, and there are opportunities for all of us to recognise Jesus' presence in our daily life.

Cultivating this way of life prepares us to be still when the opportunities arise. We're working on a relationship with God, opening up a continual conversation, so that, in church or elsewhere, whenever there is a chance to receive God's word, we are ready to still ourselves enough to hear it.
