First Reading

¹⁴I bow my knees before the Father, ¹⁵from whom every family in heaven and on earth takes its name. ¹⁶I pray that, according to the riches of his glory, he may grant that you may be strengthened in your inner being with power through his Spirit, ¹⁷and that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith, as you are being rooted and grounded in love. ¹⁸I pray that you may have the power to comprehend, with all the saints, what is the breadth and length and height and depth, ¹⁹and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, so that you may be filled with all the fullness of God. ²⁰Now to him who by the power at work within us is able to accomplish abundantly far more than all we can ask or imagine, ²¹to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus to all generations, for ever and ever.

Ephesians 3.14-21

Gospel Reading

¹Jesus went to the other side of the Sea of Galilee, also called the Sea of Tiberias. ²A large crowd kept following him, because they saw the signs that he was doing for the sick. ³Jesus went up the mountain and sat down there with his disciples. ⁴Now the Passover, the festival of the Jews, was near. ⁵When he looked up and saw a large crowd coming towards him, Jesus said to Philip, 'Where are we to buy bread for these people to eat?' ⁶He said this to test him, for he himself knew what he

was going to do. ⁷Philip answered him, 'Six months' wages would not buy enough bread for each of them to get a little.' ⁸One of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, said to Jesus, ⁹'There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish. But what are they among so many people?' ¹⁰Jesus said, 'Make the people sit down.' Now there was a great deal of grass in the place; so they sat down, about five thousand in all. ¹¹Then Jesus took the loaves, and when he had given thanks, he distributed them to those who were seated; so also the fish, as much as they wanted. ¹²When they were satisfied, he told his disciples, 'Gather up the fragments left over, so that nothing may be lost.' ¹³So they gathered them up, and from the fragments of the five barley loaves, left by those who had eaten, they filled twelve baskets. ¹⁴When the people saw the sign that he had done, they began to say, 'This is indeed the prophet who is to come into the world.' ¹⁵When Jesus realized that they were about to come and take him by force to make him king, he withdrew again to the mountain by himself.

¹⁶When evening came, his disciples went down to the lake, ¹⁷got into a boat, and started across the lake to Capernaum. It was now dark, and Jesus had not yet come to them. ¹⁸The lake became rough because a strong wind was blowing. ¹⁹When they had rowed about three or four miles, they saw Jesus walking on the lake and coming near the boat, and they were terrified. ²⁰But he said to them, 'It is I; do not be afraid.' ²¹Then they wanted to take him into the boat, and immediately the boat reached the land towards which they were going.

Thought for the week

One of my favourite places on earth is the Sea of Galilee, and the countryside around it. There is a deep calm in the area, even with coachloads of pilgrims and tourists:

9am Capernaum, 10 am Tabgha, 11am Mount of Beatitudes – Peter's fish lunch, 1.30 pm boat across the sea... rush rush, rush...

This photo was taken at Mensa Christi, the place where Jesus is said to have appeared to his friends on the seashore following his resurrection, and commissioned Peter to lead the newly emerging church. It is possible to sit by the water there and imagine that meeting 2000 years ago - and in the quiet to meet with Jesus today.

Just round the corner is the site where it is believed that Jesus fed 5000+ people. That is more challenging to imagine – the rocky bare hillsides covered with a crowd who lapped up Jesus; every word – and then lapped up the food offered to provide for their physical as well as spiritual needs. What is amazing about our God is that God cares about every part of our lives. Paul wrote to the church at Ephesus that he wanted Christians there to know '...what is the breadth and length and height and depth [of God's love] and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge..'. Still, today, through Jesus, God offers us space to rest in life (and we can do that anywhere, in our own special places) but also wants us to bring our daily physical and material needs to God in prayer. Our prayers may not be answered quite as we expect or desire, in love God always responds (even if the answer is, 'wait' or 'how about this instead').
