### Week Commencing: 29th September, St Michael and All Angels

This week we have a 10.00am Parish Communion, an activity will be available for children during the service. All are warmly invited to worship.

### The Collect

Everlasting God, you have ordained and constituted the ministries of angels and mortals in a wonderful order: grant that as your holy angels always serve you in heaven, so, at your command, they may help and defend us on earth; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, In the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God now and for ever.

#### **Post Communion Prayer**

Lord of heaven, in this eucharist you have brought us near to an innumerable company of angels and to the spirits of the saints made perfect: as in this food of our earthly pilgrimage we have shared their fellowship, so may we come to share their joy in heaven; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

### **First Reading**

<sup>10</sup>Jacob left Beer-sheba and went towards Haran. <sup>11</sup>He came to a certain place and stayed there for the night, because the sun had set. Taking one of the stones of the place, he put it under his head and lay down in that place. <sup>12</sup>And he dreamed that there was a ladder set up on the earth, the top of it reaching to heaven; and the angels of God were ascending and descending on it. <sup>13</sup>And the LORD stood beside him and said, 'I am the LORD, the God of Abraham your father and the God of Isaac; the land on which you lie I will give to you and to your offspring; <sup>14</sup>and your offspring shall be like the dust of the earth, and you shall spread abroad to the west and to the east and to the north and to the south; and all the families of the earth shall be blessed in you and in your offspring. <sup>15</sup>Know that I am with you and will keep you wherever you go, and will bring you back to this land; for I will not leave you until I have done what I have promised you.' <sup>16</sup>Then Jacob woke from his sleep and said, 'Surely the LORD is in this place – and I did not know it!' <sup>17</sup>And he was afraid, and said, 'How awesome is this place! This is none other than the house of God, and this is the gate of heaven.' *Genesis 28.10-17*

<sup>47</sup>When Jesus saw Nathanael coming towards him, he said of him, 'Here is truly an Israelite in whom there is no deceit!' <sup>48</sup>Nathanael asked him, 'Where did you come to know me?' Jesus answered, 'I saw you under the fig tree before Philip called you.' <sup>49</sup>Nathanael replied, 'Rabbi, you are the Son of God! You are the King of Israel!' <sup>50</sup>Jesus answered, 'Do you believe because I told you that I saw you under the fig tree? You will see greater things than these.' <sup>51</sup>And he said to him, 'Very truly, I tell you, you will see heaven opened and the angels of God ascending and descending upon the Son of Man.' *John 1.47-end*

### Thought for the week...

There are angels in our church! We cannot fail to see the angels moving up and down past the sleeping

Jaccob in the wall painting above the chancel arch. The



painting (actually on tiles) depicts Sunday's first reading from Genesis – the story of Jacob's dream and God's encouragement to him – through angels.

As a result of the dream Jacob felt that he was in a 'thin place' – a place where the void between heaven and earth, God and people, felt very slim. As place he deemed to be 'holy' and where God made God's presence felt.

Angels encourage, they bring God's message to people. Who are your angels today? Thin places draw us closer to God to God, even in times of trial. Where are your thin places today? As you gaze on the painting in worship may it help you to draw closer to God.
