Week commencing: 2nd May 2021 Easter 4, All Age Holy Communion

This week we have an All Age service of Holy Communion at 10 am, both in-person in church and also on zoom. The order of service has been used before and is on our website but will also be attached to the weekly email. From this week we will not be recording every service for the website – it takes a long time to prepare it to go on the website and we have had vey few full views recently. We will still record 'special' services and are looking to recording the sermon only.

Morning Prayer continues daily, Tuesday – Saturday on Zoom at 9am; Evening Prayer, Fridays at 5pm. All Saints church also offers Night Prayer on Thursdays at 8pm.

Sundays at Six continues on Zoom at 6pm on alternate Sundays each month. The next will be on 9th May, and will use the little Blue Prayer booklet.

Thought for the week:

It's the time of year when our gardens are starting to gain colour and growth again. I have noticed in the vicarage garden that daffodil and tulip bulbs have given way to the green shoots of lupins and other perennials. My herb garden is really taking off again – as are the weeds! One of the things that I find satisfying in the garden is taking cuttings and splitting larger plants to create more – and rather more cheaply than going to the garden centre.



I love watching the apple blossom on the trees give way to tiny fruits which, when protected from birds and squirrels, make wonderful apple pies... and apple wine too. The roses will soon bloom and leave their beautiful fragrance wafting through the air.

Spring and summer in the garden are times of growth and fruitfulness.

But I am also very aware that without water, tending and weeding, the growth will soon stop as the plants dry up and get choked. And my bid to save money and take cuttings does not always work unless they are pinned first to the earth to grow roots – the shoots need to be firmly embedded in the main plant in order to thrive.

Our readings this week remind us that as disciples of Jesus, we, like those plants need to be firmly rooted – shoots in the main plant, and we in Jesus. If we are to thrive in life and attain the life in all its fulness (John 10.10b) that Jesus offers, then we need to be steadfast in prayer, in Bible study (as was the Ethiopian man in the Acts reading) and in worship. We need to be rooted in the body of Christ – the church.

In the gospel today Jesus likens himself to a vine, and us as the branches, firmly rooted in him. As we share the Eucharist together, what better image – we are urged to be united with each other and with him, as he feeds us, in love.

APCM – The Annual Parochial Church Meeting will take place at 11.15am on **Sunday 23rd May 2021** in St. Luke's Church, Norfolk Road, Maidenhead SL6 7AX. This is preceded by the Annual Meeting of Parishioners to elect our churchwardens.

The APCM is when the PCC reports on its activities during the year and the financial state of the church. Elections also take place for churchwardens and PCC Members.

Nominations are now required for the 2 churchwardens, 4 PCC members (3 yrs.), 1 PCC member (1 yr.) and 1 Deanery Synod (2 yrs.).

The nomination forms for all the elections are on the table at the rear of church. Please complete the appropriate form with your nomination and hand directly toa churchwarden, the PCC secretary or one of the ministers. Please ensure you use correct form for the position you are nominating someone for. Remember that the person you are nominating must sign the form agreeing to their nomination.
