Week commencing: 2nd October 2022, Harvest Festival

This week we are celebrating our Harvest Festival with an All Age Holy Communion service in church and on zoom at 10 am. Revd. Phyl will be exploring with us how we can care for God's world and we will be using our new screen and projector – and singing along to the Harvest Samba too (well. *Strictly* is back...!!). All are very welcome. The Harvest theme continues with a Songs of Praise Sundays at Six at the Church of the Good Shepherd, Cox Green.

Harvest Gifts: as usual we are inviting people, to bring gifts of potted plants that can be blessed and taken to people on our list of recipients, as a gift of love. If you are able to drop plants off on Friday evening (8-9pm) or Saturday morning (10-11am) that would be a help, otherwise Sunday is great. The Collect

Eternal God, you crown the year with your goodness and you give us the fruits of the earth in their season: grant that we may use them to your glory, for the relief of those in need and for our own well-being; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

Post Communion

Lord of the harvest, with joy we have offered thanksgiving for your love in creation and have shared in the bread and wine of the kingdom: by your grace plant within us a reverence for all that you give us and make us generous and wise stewards of the good things we enjoy; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

A reading from Paul's letter to the Philippians

4 Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice. 5Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. 6Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. 7And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

8 Finally, beloved, whatever is true, whatever is honourable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. 9Keep on doing the things that you have learned and received and heard and seen in me, and the God of peace will be with you. *Phil. 4. 4-9*

The Gospel reading

25 When they found Jesus on the other side of the lake, they said to him, 'Rabbi, when did you come here?' 26Jesus answered them, 'Very truly, I tell you, you are looking for me, not because you saw signs, but because you ate your fill of the loaves. 27Do not work for the food that perishes, but for

the food that endures for eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you. For it is on him that God the Father has set his seal.' 28Then they said to him, 'What must we do to perform the works of God?' 29Jesus answered them, 'This is the work of God, that you believe in him whom he has sent.' 30So they said to him, 'What sign are you going to give us then, so that we may see it and believe you? What work are you performing? 31Our ancestors ate the manna in the wilderness; as it is written, "He gave them bread from heaven to eat." ' 32Then Jesus said to them, 'Very truly, I tell you, it was not Moses who gave you the bread from heaven, but it is my Father who gives you the true bread from heaven. 33For the bread of God is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world.' 34They said to him, 'Sir, give us this bread always.'
