Our service this Sunday is an All Age Holy Communion with young people helping to lead. Do bring families along to join in.

The Collect

Almighty and eternal God, who, for the firmer foundation of our faith, allowed your holy apostle Thomas to doubt the resurrection of your Son till word and sight convinced him: grant to us, who have not seen, that we also may believe and so confess Christ as our Lord and our God; who is alive and reigns with you...

The Post Communion Prayer

Lord God, the source of truth and love, keep us faithful to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, united in prayer and the breaking of bread, and one in joy and simplicity of heart, in Jesus Christ our Lord.

The Gospel reading

24 Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. 25 So the other disciples told him, 'We have seen the Lord.' But he said to them, 'Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe.'

26 A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you.' 27 Then he said to Thomas, 'Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe.' 28 Thomas answered him, 'My Lord and my God!' 29 Jesus said to him, 'Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe.'

Thought for the week: 'seeing is believing'. How do YOU see God? One of my pupils drew this picture many years ago to demonstrate how she understood God. Of course, we can't see God as such, but our mental picture influences what we believe and how we 'are' with God. Sometimes it feels like seeing God face to face might make life easier – Jesus told Thomas not to allow himself to stress about this – blessed are we who believe without needing to see. God sees us and our needs and joys – that is what matters.

Supporting Asylum seekers: Nigel Cohen (Maiden head synagogue) writes: Maidenhead currently hosts between 300-400 asylum seekers, of which around 80 are children. They have landed in Maidenhead after journeys for many of several thousand miles. Almost without exception, they have fled their country in fear of their lives. Generally, they have come with little more than the clothes on their back. And seeking asylum means they are not permitted to work and face a very uncertain future not knowing if they will be sent back to their country of origin.

A number of charities, supported strongly by our Churches, are trying to help. We are arranging a traditional English Tea in July. It will give the refugees a chance to get out, enjoy our hospitality and sample the best of our home made sandwiches and cakes. Perhaps more importantly, it will allow the asylum seekers to meet local people who care about them, their families and their suffering.

The Tea is on provisionally, Saturday 16 July at 4pm, at the Cox Green Community Centre which is within walking distance of the asylum seekers. We would love you to come to meet the asylum seekers, to share with them our human warmth and to give them hope. Anyone who wants to help by making cakes or sandwiches is also especially welcome. If you would like to come or to help with food, please email the church office with your name and the number of people you will bring with you. Please let them know if you are planning to make or bring along any food so we can make sure we have enough.

As we look into the autumn, we move into the Season of Creation.
