Week commencing: 7th May 2023, Easter 5

As we celebrate coronation weekend, our 10am service this week is an All Age Holy Communion service to which all are warmly invited. We will think about service and pray for our new King and Queen - we received the following from Lambeth Palace:

- 1. On 3 May 2023 the King directed by Royal Warrant that the prayers for or referring to members of the Royal Family should be altered, and the amended forms used thereafter. The Warrant indicates that, with effect from 6 May 2023, in every prayer for the Royal Family contained in any form of service authorized for use in the Church of England, instead of the words 'Camilla the Queen Consort' the words 'Queen Camilla' should be inserted.
- 2. From Coronation Day onward, the Prayer for the Royal Family in the Book of Common Prayer will therefore read:

Almighty God, the fountain of all goodness, we humbly beseech thee to bless Queen Camilla, William Prince of Wales, the Princess of Wales, and all the Royal Family: Endue them with thy Holy Spirit; enrich them with thy heavenly grace; prosper them with all happiness; and bring them to thine everlasting kingdom; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

From 1-3pm our coronation lunch party will be in church (we don't trust the weather). Everyone is warmly invited whether you have signed up or not. Any food/ drink may be brought into church before the service or from 12.45 pm. Please do not arrive earlier than 12.45 as we have a wedding blessing in church at midday.

The Collect

Almighty God, who through your only-begotten Son Jesus Christ have overcome death and opened to us the gate of everlasting life: grant that, as by your grace going before us you put into our minds good desires, so by your continual help we may bring them to good effect; through Jesus Christ our risen Lord.

Post Communion

Eternal God, whose Son Jesus Christ is the way, the truth, and the life: grant us to walk in his way, to rejoice in his truth, and to share his risen life; who is alive and reigns, now and for ever.

Readings for Sunday

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Standing before the high priest and the council, 55Stephen, filled with the Holy Spirit, gazed into heaven and saw the glory of God and Jesus standing at the right hand of God. 56'Look,' he said, 'I see the heavens opened and the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God!' 57But they covered their ears, and with a loud shout all rushed together against him. 58Then they dragged him out of the city and began to stone him; and the witnesses laid their coats at the feet of a young man named Saul. 59While they were stoning Stephen, he prayed, 'Lord Jesus, receive my spirit.' 60Then he knelt down and cried out in a loud voice, 'Lord, do not hold this sin against them.' When he had said this, he died.

The Gospel reading

Jesus said to his disciples: ¹'Do not let your hearts be troubled. Believe in God, believe also in me. ¹In my Father's house there are many dwelling-places. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you? ³And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, so that where I am, there you may be also. ⁴And you know the way to the place where I am going.' ⁵Thomas said to him, 'Lord, we do not know where you are going. How can we know the way?' ⑤Jesus said to him, 'I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me. ⑦If you know me, you will know my Father also. From now on you do know him and have seen him.'

⁸Philip said to him, 'Lord, show us the Father, and we will be satisfied.' ⁹Jesus said to him, 'Have I been with you all this time, Philip, and you still do not know me? Whoever has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, "Show us the Father"? ¹⁰Do you not believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in me? The words that I say to you I do not speak on my own; but the Father who dwells in me does his works. ¹¹Believe me that I am in the Father and the Father is in me; but if you do not, then believe me because of the works themselves. ¹²Very truly, I tell you, the one who believes in me will also do the works that I do and, in fact, will do greater works than these, because I am going to the Father. ¹³I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Father may be glorified in the Son. ¹⁴If in my name you ask me for anything, I will do it.'

From the PCC

Key issues discussed at the recent PCC meeting:

- Officers were elected: Vice Chair Jacqueline Lewis; Treasurer Bev Botting; Secretary –
 Jeanette Lock; Health and Safety Off8cer Simon Bader; Parish Safeguarding Officer Barbara
 Essam; Electoral Roll via the Parish Office; Standing committee reps Anne Child and Ralph
 Hinchliffe.
- Deanery Synods rep confirmed as: Ruth Sheppard, Marc Capporiccio, Jeanette Lock
- The three main charities for this year were agreed as: local Foodshare (Katty King to champion) National – Green Christians (Kim Rumble to champion) International – rebuilding after the Turkish/Syrian earthquake (via Embrace the middle East, Barbara Essam to champion)
- Fabric team is exploring three key areas: lighting, boiler replacement and churchyard
- The Institute for Children Youth and Mission is supporting our search for a Children and Family leader
- Andrew Gallacher will give the inaugural Johanna Raffan memorial recital on Sunday 8th October at 3pm.
- A nurture programme will start this month (see this sheet)
- An anonymous donor was thanked for paying for the church to be deep cleaned, we need to find more cleaners to join the regular team.
- On finance, the church currently had an overspend of £32,115.99, largely due to boiler repair
 work along with the considerable rising energy costs. While it was hoped that planned giving
 and church collections for 2023 would match that from 2022, there would still be a need to
 raise additional money. (see bellow).
- A Garden party will be arranged for early autumn (Sunday 3rd September) and a 'Not the summer fair' collection will, be held on 23rd July.
- The PCC plans to install a defibrillator.
- It was noted that the Headteacher of St. Luke's School, will be leaving this summer.
